## SWEDEN / UK

#### Seminar at Swedish Parlament

On September 27th, we had the opportunity to participate in a seminar at the Swedish Parliament with the theme "Movement is a Right - for Everyone Except the Mobility Impaired." The purpose of the seminar was to shed light on the injustices surrounding the mobility impaired individuals' right to movement and how it is deprioritized by the Swedish welfare system.

There were several speakers during this seminar with different perspectives:

Mats Wiking and Malin Danielsson, both Members of the Swedish Parliament.

Ingrid Liljeroth, a psychologist, lecturer, special educator, and author of several books on Conductive Education, talked about how society's attitude towards the mobility impaired has changed over the past decades.

Dr. Melanie M. Brown, a Conductive Education consultant and Chair of the Professional Conductors Association (UK), discussed Conductive Education internationally from a UK perspective and emphasized the importance of this educational method for the overall development of mobility impaired individuals as individuals.

Two families were also present, sharing their thoughts and experiences with Conductive Education and its impact on their lives.

Finally, Eszter Horváth Tóthné, a certified Conductor, CEO of Move & Walk, and Vice President of ECA, spoke about her experiences with Conductive Education in Sweden and the challenges of having to import other conductors/workforce with Conductive Education competence from abroad due to the lack of equivalent education in Sweden.

The speakers resonated with the audience, mostly consisting of Members of Parliament and regional politicians, and we received very positive feedback. The work continues to gain acceptance for the Conductor profession in Sweden and to spread awareness about Conductive Education so that more people can benefit from this concept and reach their full potential.

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# Conductive Education & Rehabilitation writes history with the BKF Bundesverband Konduktive Förderung nach Petö & the Bundesverband der in Deutschland tätigen KonduktorInnen



In 1998 parents, conductors, pedagogical and therapeutic professionals founded representations of interests in Kassel and Nuremberg, to enable a life with self-determination and participation for children with disabilities. They placed the foundation stone for the entry of conductive pedagogy and rehabilitation in many institutions in Germany!

The 25-year jubilee celebration of the Bundesverband Konduktive Förderung nach Petö and the Konduktorenverband took place on 1-2 October in Germany, Nuremberg. Professional, informative and internationally well attended - what an amazing success!

Almost one year of preparation work went into the lovingly organised and presented event. Personalities and lecturers in the field conduction, specialized education, medicine, therapy and public live, informed with presentations, lecturers, information, posters, discussions and video messages.

Marita Holper, Chairperson of the Bundesverbandes Konduktive Förderung nach Petö e.V. and Zsuzsanna Hadházi, board member of the Konduktorenverband and Krisztina Desits, Teacher at the EVHN opened the congress Sunday. Daniela Ludwig, Member of Parliament, and patron of the BKF sent her greetings with message to the guests via video. "I am deeply impressed how independent the children and teenagers become with conductive education. Conduction and inclusion belong inextricable together", she said.

Prof. Dr. rer. pol. Brigitte Bürkle, Vice President at EVHN, welcomed the scientific program on the congress Monday. Councilor Michael Ziegler, in representation of the mayor, Marcus König, of Nuremberg, talked about the still missing acceptance of the conductor profession and urged politics for a quick action in this matter for the well-being of the disabled. He also talked about the missing personnel and called it "an ongoing crisis in

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kindergarten and in the caring sector. We are at a limit and there is no relief in sight, politics has a distinguished share of the responsibility and in particular a duty to guide us out of this crisis", he said.

Next to professionals, families, disabled people, students and representatives of conductive associations, were guests as well as many important well know lecturers. Prof. Dr. Dieter Lotz, former head of department specialized education (SE) EVHN, Prof. Dr. Walter Strobl, University Krems, Prof. Dr. Birgit Mayer-Lewis, head of department SE EVHN as well as Dr. Zsofia Kallay, PAF, were key speakers. Prof. Dr. K. Weber, German pioneer of CE since 1988 and author of many reference books, unfortunately had to cancel her attendance due to illness, as well as the PT and senior conductor, Helga Keil-Bastendorff, founder of the Helga Keil Bastendorff foundation, Vienna. She sent an important statement to current subjects. Ernst Albrecht von Moreau, CEO, Beate Höß-Zenker and Susanne Schönwälder, both managing directors, represented the foundation Pfennigparade and Phoenix, which support the academic study program at the EVHN with focus on CE and inclusion, for 5 years as one of the biggest institutions of conductive education in Germany. Tatijana von Quadt, CEO of FortSchritt Starnberg, represented Peter and Hanni von Quadt, founders of the German parents associations.

Representatives of the Semmelweis University, Andràs Petö Faculty and representatives of the Helga Keil Bastendorff Stiftung were speakers and presented current ideas for future study programs and cooperations between Hungary, Austria and Germany. Scientific work and findings of effectiveness were an important part of the congress. Possible master studies in pedagogy, rehabilitation and care were brought into focus. Next to professional lectures and workshops, also stage discussions with people with disability and colleagues on the subject "Cooperation at Universities" and "Why CE" took place.

Dr.Zsofia Kallay und Szabolcs Tiger of the András Petö Faculty impressed with innovative presentations towards new suggestions of future cooperation.

The "Golden Petö Chair" was presented as a sign of special earnings in CE by BKF board member and ECA President Beate Höß-Zenker to Rike Bock, physiotherapist, PTK/specialized teacher, lecturer, writer and Katalin Örfalfy, senior conductor of the Petö Institute and longtime professional supervisor in Germany. The by now 85-year-old lady was touched by the honour and held a wonderful speech.

Accompanied by the event a big poster gallery was presented: members,

associations, personal data sheets of people with disability and scientific posters were shown in an impressive way. The conductor association organized a "favourite aid" corner for conductors and therapists to exchange their experiences and findings. Elisabeth Pitz, PtK/specialized teacher, BKF board member, organized an interesting "scientific corner" with actual BA and MA thesis' in relation to CE and her own workshop. Good catering was organized together with 25<sup>th</sup> jubilee cake – everybody enjoyed it. After the congress program a little sightseeing tour and a festive meal with networking party were part of the event.

On Monday the organisers and guests came together for a photo shooting in preparation for World CP Day which has its own jubilee in Germany in 2023 - 10 years! The shooting took place with many green balloons and a self-made green balloon arch and green dress code.

This was a successful event in good atmosphere with many well-known faces, exchange, ideas and faith for the future and further milestones in Conductive Education in Germany and Austria. We thank all our guests,
