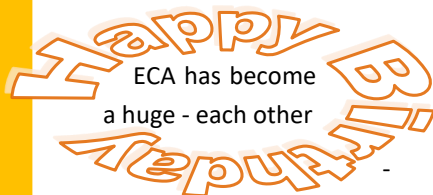
ECAs 20 year success story

MSc “Konduktive Förderung” at University for Continuing Education Krems – new graduates, new scientific theses

This spring 3 students concluded their studies with the defense of their master theses. Very interesting research issues were presented:

Laura Forster: Therapy Fatigue in Young Adults with Infantile Cerebral Palsy: Causes and Strategies for Overcoming it in Conductive Rehabilitation

Sebastian Vitti: Development of a Conductive Learning Program for Eye Control – Impact on the Use of Eye-Controlled Communication Devices for Adolescents with ICP Aged Fourteen to Seventeen

Sigrid Anibas: Therapeutic Approaches in the Treatment of Spastic Pes Equinus in Conductive Rehabilitation, Illuminating Conservative Treatment Methods – A Scoping Review

Susanne Schulz: The added value of motivation in the CE rehabilitation process (thesis not available in the library)

All theses are written in German language and are available at the library of the University. The remaining students are expected to submit their master's theses by the summer.

The 2nd round of the MSc course is currently in its 2nd semester.

Interested persons also have the option of acquiring and certifying lectures and modules as micro credentials. With the exception of one English block, all lectures are currently in German language.

The cooperation between the foundation (H. Keil-Bastendorff Stiftung) and the university (University for Continuing Education, Krems) will be expanded even further: in future, the practice-oriented, basic introductory courses will also be organized jointly. We are grateful for this valuable and fruitful cooperation!

10 Years of Stepping Forward: A Time to Reflect on Goals

Upon entering my position as CEO of Tsad Kadima, 10 years ago, I set two main goals:

1. Strengthening the CE approach as Tsad Kadima's leading methodology

After so many years (37), the uniqueness of the CE approach cannot be taken for granted and requires a fresh perspective.

The training program that we operated for about 30 years in partnership with the Peto Institute needed to adjust itself to current needs.

About 4 years ago, we embarked on a new program, which is more concise and

based mainly on the students' practical experience.

2. Expanding the organization to new areas

About a decade ago, Tsad Kadima began developing programs and frameworks for young adults. We opened day centers, enabling the organization to continue supporting children who have become adults.

The principles of CE are reflected in strengthening the abilities for independence in the community, developing social skills, and learning new subjects.

We at Tsad Kadima invite our partners

and colleagues in the field of CE to join us in thinking together about the further development of the approach in the coming years.

Semmelweis University András Pető Faculty

EUniWell project – The Semmelweis University is a founding member of the European University for Well-Being (EUniWell) which is a higher educational alliance of European universities working together on different research topics. The András Pető Faculty, led by Dr. Ibolya Turi, took part in the project, which examined the welfare of teachers in the participating countries. Other partners in the project were the University of Florence, the University of Cologne, and the University of Murcia. Renovation at Villányi Street - The Villányi Street campus of András Pető Faculty just opened its new wing for students and colleagues alike. A huge renovation project went underway during the last semester as a result, students in primary and vocational schools can now develop through conductive pedagogy in renewed student spaces, renovated classrooms, and a modern infrastructure. The new master's program has been launched – The András Pető Faculty is happy to announce that its new master's program, Neurorehabilitation Specialist MSc now available in Hungarian language and it will be available in English language from 2025. This master's program will provide an opportunity not only for conductors to graduate from a higher level of education but also for many allied professionals to gain a better understanding of neuromuscular rehabilitation and at the same time an insight into conductive pedagogy. It is important, that the MSc program is not a new conductive pedagogy training program as its content is based heavily on medical expertise. Successful Erasmus + project with Chile - The András Pető Faculty of Semmelweis University recently concluded a successful Erasmus+ project in collaboration with the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile.
